## PATIENT QUESTIONNAIRE

### MRI

**PACEMAKER: If you have a pacemaker, MRI is not recommended for you.**

MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) utilizes a magnet and radio waves to obtain images inside body. The magnet may affect any electronic or metallic objects, in addition to things with magnetic strips as driver's license and credit cards. In order to ensure your safety and comfort, Loma Linda High Field Open MRI (H.O.P.E.) has provided this guideline for your information.

Please let us know if you have any of the following?

- Pacemaker
- Aneurysm Clips
- Pregnant
- Intra-ocular foreign body (foreign body in the eyes)
- Cochlear implants (inner ear implants)
- Hearing aid
- Brain or Spinal Cord stimulator

In addition, please notify H.O.P.E. if you have the following:

- removable orthodontics (dentures, etc.)
- removable jewelries (including belly rings, etc.)
- metallic prosthesis or devices
- previous surgery
- gunshot wound
- surgery within the last 8 weeks

### **CLAUSTROPHOBIA and SEDATION**

While H.O.P.E. is an **open MRI scanner** with a wider opening for patient comfort, we recognize that some patients may still feel anxious about MRI.

Should you feel the need to have sedation, please inform our office prior to your scheduled exam. You **must** have someone to drive you home after the test should a sedation be necessary. A friend or family member may also be with you in the exam room, provided they have no pacemaker or other contra-indications for MRI as listed above.
